FYI: LETTER FROM THE MARK WEST DISTRICT PTA PRESIDENT

In The Lark last month, Mark West Union School District Superintendent Kay Schultz shared some of the reasons Mark West District parents love our schools. This month, I'd like to share with you some of the ways the local PTA (Parent-Teacher Association) supports District goals and how local businesses can help.

The Mark West District PTA is a non-profit organization supported entirely by volunteers and donations with the goal of "Making Every Child's Potential a Reality." Each school year, the PTA raises funds and invests them enriching the experiences of the 1300 students in the Mark West Union School District. We support academics, art, athletics, culture, music, science, and social activities. The Back-to-School Carnival, Accelerated Reader classroom learning tool, BMX Stunt Bike demonstration, and Sock Hop Student Dance are but a few examples. Over the past three years, the PTA has invested over \$375,000 in our children's potential.

It is no surprise that we are entering a time of deep economic challenge for our state government. Governor Schwarzenegger is planning a 10% funding cut across all state programs, including schools. This amounts to about \$1,000,000 in lost funding for the Mark West School District. There are three actions I ask you to consider to help us maintain our high educational standards during this challenging time:

1) Let the Governor and your state representatives know you believe we should preserve quality education by not suspending Proposition 98 provisions voted into law in 1988 to protect school funding during times like these. Learn more at capta.org (Flunk the Budget) or mwusd.org (08-09 Budget Information).

2) Sponsor a school event. A small investment by your business can get your name in front of hundreds of local parents and enrich our students' lives. Chamber member Will Ruffin of CellularWorld has taken the lead by sponsoring the upcoming Student Spring Dance. Contact me for more information.

SONOMA COUNTY INNOVATION COUNCIL

Over the next 10 years, the Sonoma County economy will be faced with a number of formidable challenges and exciting opportunities. Unprecedented change is expected in several areas including workforce demographics, global competitiveness, and availability of natural resources, among others. In confronting these new realities, Sonoma County has the ability to seize important opportunities such as new emerging industries that need support for their future success.

The challenges facing our region require creativity and innovation to ensure Sonoma County remains economically competitive. Therefore, the Sonoma County Economic Development Board (EDB), Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E), the Workforce Investment Board (WIB), and the Sonoma County Water Agency (SCWA), in cooperation with a number of groups, propose the development of an economic strategic plan for Sonoma County.

The plan, to be completed within one year, is designed primarily to create actionable strategies to help ensure a viable business climate and healthy economy in the coming decade. The effort is being overseen by an ad hoc advisory committee appointed by the Board of Supervisors comprised of a broad-based group of business and community leaders known as the Sonoma County Innovation Council.

The Council's purpose is to recommend a plan of action – including benchmarks, timelines, roles and responsibilities – for dealing with the economic challenges facing Sonoma County in the next 10 years. Because the challenges are great, and resources are limited, this project will provide the county's economic actors – business owners, government agencies, educational providers, business/professional organizations, and other interest groups – the opportunity to work together with the community in a coordinated effort to promote sustainable economic development.


