FOUNTAINGROVE MARRIOTT GETS APPROVAL IN SANTA ROSA, WILL NEED AN EVACUATION PLAN

Santa Rosa's City Council signed off on a new Residence Inn by Marriott in fire-ravaged Fountaingrove, after developers agreed to submit an evacuation plan for city approval and dig deeper into their hilly plot to preserve views for patients at a nearby cancer treatment facility.

The proposed 114-room, four-story, extended-stay hotel, which the council approved on a 5-1 vote Tuesday, still needs architectural approval from a city board and is likely years away from opening. It is a joint effort between Telecom Valley entrepreneur Ajaib Bhadare and nationwide hotel developer Tharaldson Hospitality.

The permit is a key one for the development in the high-risk fire zone — near the former Hilton Sonoma Wine Country hotel and the Fountaingrove Inn, both of which were destroyed in the October 2017 Tubbs fire — on the condition that it comes with an evacuation plan reviewed and approved by the Santa Rosa Fire Department.

That's above and beyond typical regulations and comes on top of the hotel's commitment to comply with "building codes, fire codes, every code in existence," said Tina Wallis, a Santa Rosa land-use attorney hired to advocate for the project. She noted the project was supported by numerous nearby businesses, including Keysight, Medtronic, Sutter Health and Kaiser Permanente.

SUTTER ANNOUNCES \$158M EXPANSION TO ITS SANTA ROSA HOSPITAL

Sutter Santa Rosa Regional Hospital announced that it will hold a groundbreaking event on Sept. 20 at 11 a.m. to mark the official start of its \$158 million expansion project — a 3-story structure that will add dozens of hospital beds, more treatment areas in the emergency room, and additional surgical suites.

"The expansion is a \$158 million project and also will include a \$15 million capital campaign for philanthropy for (more) services, innovation programs and technology," said Lisa Amador.

assistant administrator and director of philanthropy, North Bay Sutter Health. Sutter is taking a two-pronged approach to the expansion.

The first will be a three-story tower on the east side of the hospital, located next to the medical office building. The tower will include 40 additional beds, plus two more operating rooms to be located on the lower floor. The timeline for completion is April 2022.


The second phase of the expansion involves increasing the hospital's emergency room department. The work involves renovating the internal part of the building to accommodate an additional nine treatment areas, bringing the total number to 27. The expansion project will mark the completion of the entire Sutter hospital plan, according Gary Helfrich, a planner with Permit Sonoma.
