LOCAL WINE SECTOR FORECAST

PRESENTED BY SONOMA COUNTY EDB, RESEARCH BY MOODY'S

The Sonoma County Economic Development Board (EDB), in partnership with the Sonoma County Workforce Investment Board, is pleased to present the 2016 Wine Industry Insider for Sonoma County. Our research partner, Moody's Analytics, provided the research for this report

Highlights of the 2016 Wine Industry Insider include:

• Sonoma County vintners closed out 2015 on a high note and are holding their ground in the increasingly competitive marketplace for fine and premium wines. With the U.S. economy hitting full stride, wine drinkers are trading up to higher priced bottles, boosting sales of higherend wines produced in Sonoma County.

• Though the average price of California grapes plummeted by 10% in 2015, prices for grapes grown in Sonoma posted a healthy 5.3% gain. Retail wine and grape prices do not always move hand in hand, but with grape quality among the highest in the state, rising demand will

help Sonoma winemakers recover pricing power ceded in the aftermath of the Great Recession.

• While millennials consume more wine than past generations, they have reached drinking age in an era of cheap imports and ever increasing options for alcoholic beverages. Absent initiatives to market American wines to this key demographic, Sonoma vintners risk ceding market share to craft beverages in the long run.



NORTH BAY UNEMPLOYMENT RATES CONTINUE TO FALL IN MAY

Industry unemployment rates for May continued to fall across all six North Bay counties, according to new state figures.

Marin County's jobless rate fell below the 3 percent mark to 2.8 percent, only 0.2 percentage points below the lowest county in the state, San Mateo, at 2.6 percent...

Mendocino County's statewide ranking rose five places between April and May to No. 15.

Jobs in educational and health services continue to make big gains in all counties except Napa, which remained unchanged again this month, as more people are insured under the Affordable Care Act, and hospitals and medical facilities are increasing staff. Joining in the gains were jobs in leisure and hospitality in all counties, along with government jobs. Construction jobs rose in Solano and Marin counties.

SONOMA COUNTY

The unemployment rate in the Sonoma County was 3.5 percent in May 2016, down from a revised 3.8 percent in April 2016, and below the year-ago estimate of 4.3 percent.

This compares with an unadjusted unemployment rate of 4.7 percent for California and 4.5 percent for the nation during the same period

The county dropped one point to the sixth-lowest jobless rate in the state, preceded by Napa, Santa Clara, San Francisco, Marin, and San Mateo counties.

The number of Sonoma County nonfarm jobs for the month was up 200, to 201,200 and up 3,600 for the year, at 1.8 percent. Farming employment for the month was up 1,000, to 6,300, and down 300 for the year, at -4.5 percent.

Leading job-adding industries over the year were education and health services, up 1,000 jobs, or 3.1 percent, to 33,200; leisure and hospitality, up 600 jobs, or 2.4 percent, to 25,400; and government up 500 jobs, or 1.5 percent, to 33,100.

Job losing industries in the last 12 months were state government excluding education down 200, at 7.4 percent, to 2,500; and state government down 100, at 1.9 percent, to 5,200.

The only industry remaining unchanged over 12 months was in

With the arrival of the Memorial Day weekend, the summer travel season is poised to get rolling in Sonoma County. Travel officials and hoteliers are expecting plenty of business and say demand is prompting hospitality companies to build new hotels and enlarge existing properties.

"We feel it is a really good time to expand," said Percy Brandon, general manager of the Vintners Inn just north of Santa Rosa.

The inn's management is seeking permits to add 34 rooms and a full spa to the existing 44room hotel, which is home to John Ash & Co restaurant. Brandon said demand remains strong for the inn's lodging units even in the off-season,
