GUIDANCE FOR THE USE OF FACE COVERINGS

Adapted from a circular from the State of California Health and Human Services Agency, California Department of Public Health, issued June 18, 2020

Because of our collective actions, California has limited the spread of COVID-19 and associated hospitalizations and deaths in our state. Still, the risk for COVID-19 remains and the increasing number of Californians who are leaving their homes for work and other needs, increases the risk for COVID-19 exposure and infection.

Over the last four months, we have learned a lot about COVID-19 transmission, most notably



that people who are infected but are asymptomatic or pre-symptomatic play an important part in community spread. The use of face coverings by everyone can limit the release of infected droplets when talking, coughing, and/or sneezing, as well as reinforce physical distancing.

This document updates existing CDPH guidance for the use of cloth face coverings by the general public when outside the home. It mandates that face coverings be worn state-wide in the circumstances and with the exceptions outlined below. It does not substitute for existing guidance about social distancing and handwashing.

Guidance

People in California must wear face coverings when they are in the high-risk situations listed below:

• Inside of, or in line to enter, any indoor public space;

• Obtaining services from the healthcare sector in settings including, but not limited to, a hospital, pharmacy, medical clinic, laboratory, physician or dental office, veterinary clinic, or blood bank;

• Waiting for or riding on public transportation or paratransit or while in a taxi, private car service, or ride-sharing vehicle;

• Engaged in work, whether at the workplace or performing work off-site, when interacting inperson with any member of the public...

Sonoma County Tourism is the official destination stewardship organization for California's Sonoma County. SCT is a private, non-profit marketing and sales organization dedicated to promoting overnight stays and creating a sustainable hospitality economy in Sonoma County. Part of the SCT mission is to track the numbers behind tourism in Sonoma County,

a particularly important activity during the Covid-19 crisis. The table above is a digest of their most recent findings and was delivered to their subscribers via email on June 24, 2020.

Findings include:

• Americans are feeling less restriction on their budgets and their travel dollars, and their interest in traveling has increased from 46.1% to 48.3%.

• However, half of American travelers feel the coronavirus situation will get worse in the U.S. in the next month and less than 20% feel it will get better. This is leading to some travel cancellations.

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BUSINESS SPOTLIGHT CHARLES M. SCHULZ–SONOMA COUNTY AIRPORT: THE SKY'S THE LIMIT

Air travel has become a key part of the modern world. Whether visiting loved ones in distant states or taking a business trip across the ocean, long-distance travel is made easier through air travel.

Many frequent flyers know large, international airports such as SFO or OAK, but local county airports, such as Sonoma County's Charles M. Schulz – Sonoma County Airport (KSTS), are just as important. Whether to make a connection at another airport, or for a complete round trip, the Sonoma County Airport is ready to give passengers their best.

The Airport's history began in 1941, when Sonoma County purchased the land. The Airport was constructed, but would not exist for long before changing hands for a short time. In 1942, the United States military acquired control of the property due to wartime needs. While under the military, the Airport grounds saw significant expansion, including an expanded runway and

the construction of proper hangars. After serving as a training ground and base during the war, the property was returned to Sonoma County in 1946, where the Airport is now a part of the Department of Transportation & Public Works.

Today, the Sonoma County Airport is working on an expansion of its terminal building, in order to better accommodate passengers in an ever-busier world. Significant air traffic comes from a number of sources, both public and private. Three major airlines (Alaska Airlines, American Airlines, and United Airlines) operate out of the Airport, serving commercial passengers. Several local emergency services are permitted to use the Airport for their air vehicles, including REACH, CAL FIRE, and the Sonoma County Sheriff's Office, while other air traffic comes from smaller tenants, including private planes and flight schools. For passenger transportation on the ground, the Airport works with fellow Mark West Area Chamber of Commerce corporate sponsor Sonoma County Airport Express.

The Sonoma County Airport also provides spaces for other businesses that are not directly related to aviation. Several smaller businesses operate on Airport-owned property, including the Sky Lounge restaurant, located inside the main terminal, and the Pacific Coast Air Museum, home to many vintage aircraft that are available for public viewing. These tenants and Fixed Based Operators (FBOs), along with grants from the Federal Aviation Administration, enable the Airport to operate as an enterprise fund, rather than taking a part of the county's general fund.

The California fires of the past few years have seen significant use of Airport resources, due in part to the Airport's use as an air attack base for CAL FIRE. CAL FIRE has been located on the property for several decades, and currently stages two S2T tankers, an OV-10 Bronco, and a Sikorsky Skycrane helicopter. Airport business was somewhat affected by the Tubbs Fire in 2017 and the Kincade Fire in 2019, but the Airport quickly resumed routine operation once the fires were contained.

As a member of the Mark West Area Chamber of Commerce, the Sonoma County Airport continues to operate to the best of its ability. From air travel, to dining, to museums, the Airport is able to offer Sonoma County residents comfortable and uncomplicated service. To the Chamber, Airport Manager Jon Stout has a few words: "The Airport is proud to contribute to the local economy and values its local partners. Thank you for supporting STS!"
