
#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

#### **UPDATE ON FIRE SERVICE**

A majority of the Mark West area lies within the Rincon Valley Fire Protection District. The primary station serving the Mark West area is located on Lark Center Drive (across from the Larkfield Shopping Center). The normal staffing at that station is a minimum of three (24 hours per day) and there is often a fourth member of the crew.

The Larkfield station is one of four within the district. The others are located in the Rincon Valley area, the Alpine area, and the Bellevue area. The Bellevue station is the only other station in the district with 24-hour staffing. There are response agreements in place with the neighboring agencies that provide for the closest resource to be dispatched and consequently it is quite common for agencies to cross boundaries to provide service.

The Rincon Valley and Windsor fire districts created a joint powers authority in 2011 to manage both districts. This agreement allowed the management functions to be consolidated. The cost reduction

derived from the consolidated management allowed both districts to maintain staffing on the fire engines during the economic downturn.

As the future unfolds, there are several things being explored related to fire protection in the local area as well as throughout Sonoma County. The Rincon Valley district continues to explore the possibility of allowing the Santa Rosa Fire Department to operate the district under contract. Rincon Valley and Windsor will continue to refine their relationship as time goes on. The County of Sonoma, with the encouragement of Supervisor (soon to be Senator) McGuire and others have embarked upon a county-wide analysis of the delivery of fire services. There are no preconceived conclusions to that study.

Finally, we should note that President of the Mark West Area Chamber of Commerce, Steve Plamann, will be joining the board of directors for the Windsor Fire Protection District in December. There will certainly be no lack of opportunities to look for ways to refine the services that are delivered to all of the communities.
