SONOMA COUNTY ALLOCATES \$25 MILLION FOR VEGETATION MANAGEMENT

From a "District 4 Weekly Update" email, sent October 13, 2020, by the office of James Gore, 4th District Supervisor

Three years ago, many of our lives changed as Sonoma County experienced what at the time was the most destructive wildfire in California history.

At the time, it was hard to imagine how we would ever recover and how long it would take us to



get there. With 110,000 acres burned, 6,700 structures destroyed and \$10 billion of damage, there seemed to be no end in sight.

Little did we know that one of the most devastating experiences of our lives would make us stronger as we rebuilt our community. We've seen neighbors come together, homes rebuilt, and our community has been recovering. Today, over 3,700 homes have been rebuilt or are in the process.

We've come so far, yet we still have a lot more work to do going forward. As we push towards a more resilient community, Sonoma County continues to implement the Recovery & Resilience Framework.

As I drive through our District, I am reminded of what it takes to build a community -- you, your families, your hope, and your determination to move forward even during the most difficult times.

I have personally heard from many of you and have listened to your concerns, and have advocated on your behalf. Because of your voice, the County is increasing its investment in resiliency. During our October 6 Board of Supervisors meeting, we allocated a minimum of \$25 million for vegetation management for fire prevention and \$10 million to replace destroyed workforce housing. We also plan to dedicate additional funds to repair roads damaged during the wildfires and take further actions to expedite recovery.

Thank you for being engaged in our community! Please continue to speak up and stay connected. Stay safe, stay Sonoma Strong, and let's become Sonoma Ready.

COVID-19 WORKPLACE EXPOSURE STATE REQUIREMENTS

Adapted from an email by the Sonoma County Economic Development Board, October 23, 2020

AB 685 (Chapter 84, Statutes of 2020) is a new California law that **requires employers to notify employees** who may have been exposed to COVID-19 and to **report workplace outbreaks of COVID-19** to their local health department.

Contact County of Sonoma Public Health Disease Control Department at (707) 565-4566 immediately after three or more laboratory-confirmed cases of COVID-19 occur among workers who live in different households within a two-week period.

Under AB 685, a COVID-19 case is someone who:

- Has a positive viral test for COVID-19,
- Is diagnosed with COVID-19 by a licensed health care provider,
- Is ordered to isolate for COVID-19 by a public health official, OR
- Dies due to COVID-19, as determined by a public health department.

Employer Guidance on AB 685: Definitions

Notify Employees of Workplace Outbreaks

Upon identifying a COVID-19 case in the workplace, you need to provide the following information:

- 1. Notice to your employees and the employer of subcontracted workers that they may have been exposed to COVID-19. More information and details.
 - 2. Information about benefits & options. More information and details.
 - 3. A disinfection & safety plan. More information and details.

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
